Bill No.	Bill Sponsor	Bill Summary	Official Language
<b>HB 4696</b>	Penelope Tsernoglou (HD-75)	Penalties for disclosing election results from an early voting site before election day	<a href="#">Michigan Legislature House Bill 4696 (2023)</a>
<b>HB 4702</b>	Penelope Tsernoglou (HD-75)	Increase the number of active registered voters in an election precinct from 2,999 to 5,000	<a href="#">Michigan Legislature House Bill 4702 (2023)</a>

\*None of the Prop 22-2 bills passed with enough support for immediate effect

\*\*Bills won't take effect until 90 days after the legislative session (December)
